



## **Guidelines for Harvesting Morel Mushroom in White River First Nation Traditional Territory**

1. Please contact our Lands and Resources Department in Whitehorse or Main Administrative Office in Beaver Creek to fill out your harvest permission form. Be prepared to provide details on camp & harvest locations, duration, group size, and method of access.
2. Do not harvest or camp on White River First Nation Interim Protected Lands. For details on where these parcels are located, please see the map provided below or see Yukon Lands Viewer for more details.
3. Practice “leave no trace” camping principles such as disposing of waste properly, leaving what you find, minimizing campfire impacts, respecting wildlife, and being considerate of other people.
4. Respect our lands, water, and people while using this area by complying with the guidelines above. Our land officers will be patrolling these areas to ensure the compliance and safety of all harvesters.
5. The safety of our community is our top priority, we ask that you please stay up to date and follow the current orders and recommendations from the Chief Medical Officer relating to the spread of COVID-19.

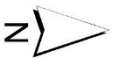
